

My Promise, My Faith Virtual Event Worksheet

There are five steps to earning the *My Promise*, *My Faith* award. Please prepare the steps below. The rest of the requirements will be completed as part of the event.

Prepare for a girl-led experience!

These need to be completed and brought with you to the class.

- 1. Choose a line from the Girl Scout Law that you want to connect to your faith.
- 2. Select or create a story, poem or song from your faith to share that goes along with the line of the Girl Scout Law you picked. If you want to play a music video, etc., you will have the option to share your screen.
- **3. Interview:** Find a woman in your faith community and interview her or you can research a female historical figure who was influenced by her faith in her life. You can do this in person, over the phone, Skype, etc. Everyone will be sharing their interviews. Feel free to be as creative as you would like. If you want to use a phone and record, we can play it at the event.

Interview ideas:

- Share with your person the line of the Girl Scout Law that you chose. Ask her how she uses that line of the Girl Scout Law in her life. (Required)
- · What does her faith mean to her?
- How does she incorporate her faith in her everyday life?
- What are some things she has learned (about herself, her faith, etc.) by connecting to her faith?
- Any other questions you are interested in asking?

Picture: (optional)

- Option 1 Historical person Photo from book or Internet.
- Option 2 Bring a picture of her with you to the event. (It can be a screenshot on another digital device.)
- **4. Keepsake:** Make something to remind you of what you learned. Gather your materials to assemble during the event. Girls will be working on it during the session. You can make a poster, drawing, painting, journal, scrapbook or collage. You can incorporate inspirational quotes by women, verses/words from religious instructions, etc.

More ways to connect your faith and Girl Scouts

- Talk to your Girl Scout leadership about other ways you can connect faith and Girl Scouts: Participate in Girl Scouts Celebrate Faith as part of Girl Scout Week each March, religious fun patch programs, virtual faith-based programming opportunities or maybe incorporate your faith in a highest award project!

- Linking the national pin into their faith's religous recognitions
- · Guiding girls through their personal faith journey
- Helping girls strengthen their understanding of their faith
